

LENT 2016 - A Season of Mercy

Lent is always considered a season of God's Mercy. However, during the course of this liturgical year, there is a heightened awareness of mercy with it being the **Year of Mercy** in the Church. Giving and receiving mercy is central to living the life God calls us to. We all need mercy at different times in our lives, and we all have an obligation to give mercy to others. We have to admit that God's mercy is overwhelmingly generous so He calls us to respond with the same spirit of generosity.

Receiving Mercy: are there areas of my life where I need Gods forgiveness, comfort, healing, hope or faith? That we consider praying with the scriptures everyday. Plan to receive the sacrament of reconciliation.

Giving Mercy: - Forgive others who have hurt me - ("In the name of Jesus I forgive Name for ??? "); help the needy, abandoned, rejected and lonely; visit the sick and elderly; pray for the living and dead; comfort and encourage the afflicted, bear wrongs patiently; loan to the one who cannot repay us; give a second chance to the one who failed us or sinned against us; look at every one as if it were Jesus who is needing our help. "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me". Matt 25:40.

SELF-EXAMINATION:

- 1. Do you invite people to your home that cannot return the favour?
- 2. Do you set aside some money each week to help the poor?
- 3. Is it hard for you to forgive someone who hurt you?
- 4. Do you feel grateful for all the Lord has done for you?
- 5. Do you visit the sick at home or in the hospital or nursing home?
- 6. Am I able to give people a "second chance"? How many second chances has God given us?
- 7. Do you avoid associating or talking to the poor or minorities?
- 8. Have I asked for the mercy of God in my life today?

Lastly, please consider using Matthew Kelly's book "Rediscover Jesus" which offers a daily meditation for the Season of Lent.

NORMS FOR LENTEN OBSERVANCE

The liturgical season of Lent begins February 10. The following are guidelines of Lenten observance for the faithful in the Archdiocese of

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.
- Fridays are days of abstinence.

Fasting binds all persons who have completed their 18th birthday through those who have completed their 59th year, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids

Abstinence binds all persons who have completed their 14th birthday, unless prevented by poor health. In the Archdiocese of Ottawa, the consumption of meat is not allowed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. The Archbishop mandates this observance for the spiritual well-being of the faithful.

Lent is a penitential season and, as such, religious practices such as daily Mass, the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Stations of the Cross, works of charity and justice, and acts of selfdenial are highly encouraged.

We will profess the Apostles' Creed during the Lenten and Easter seasons so as to be in solidarity with the catechumens.
