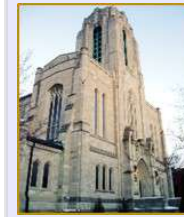

"The gifts he gave were that some would be APOSTLES, some PROPHETS, some EVANGELISTS, some PASTORS, and some TEACHERS, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for the building up of the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity to the measure of the full stature of Christ"—Ephesians 4: 11-13

"Each of you was given grace, according to the measure of Christ's gift"—Ephesians 4:7

UNDERSTANDING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS (A.P.E.S.T.)

APOSTLES: Those who challenge the status quo, push or drag the Church into new territory, start new things.

PROPHETS: Those who go to God and come from God. Prayer intercessors, those who deliver a challenging message, often on issues of justice.

EVANGELISTS: Those who have a passion for people to come to know Jesus. Those who have a gift for recruiting others to cause.

SHEPHERDS: Those who are mindful of caring for others, mindful of who is being left out. The "arms of the parish."

TEACHERS: Those passionate about catechesis, right doctrine.

In all that we have been given by God, through Jesus Christ, we must seek to give back to the best of our ability, understanding that it is HIS WILL that we are called to be subject to and not our own. In doing so, we then, with the 'Gifts' we have, work diligently to build up the Kingdom of God.

As we celebrate the great Solemnity of Christ the King and look forward to the beginning of the New Liturgical Year next week, 1st Sunday of Advent, may we be guided by the Sceptre of Grace to be true Disciples of Christ, living our lives as the sons and daughters of God, going forth into the world, well equipped to share the Gospels by our lives.
